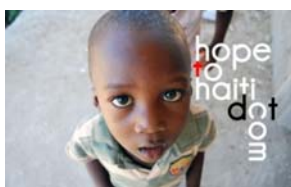


# Most High Ministries Hope to Haiti

Monday July 12th will mark six months since 230,000 to 260,000 people lost their lives when a 7.0 earthquake struck Haiti. Haiti sits only 700 miles of the coast of Miami and what was once known as the poorest country in the Western Hemisphere now has the title of the poorest country in the world.



700 miles.... if you were to drive 700 miles west of Tallahassee, Florida would find yourself in Houston, Texas.

700 miles north and you will be near Lexington, Kentucky.

Below is a recent story from a Montreal Newspaper.

*"After six months of living first under bed sheets and towels, and now inside torn, sweltering and soaked tents suitable at best for weekend camping, the stress in Haiti's crowded and unsanitary camps is beginning to grow. Normally patient Haitians, already traumatized by the massive loss of life in January's unprecedented earthquake, are starting to lose it.*

*"I have to leave Haiti," says Genevieve Joubert, a nurse living with about 10,500 others on the former soccer pitch now known as camp Dadadou. "But there's nowhere to go."*

*Around Port-au-Prince, which, six months after the Jan. 12 quake, still looks like a war zone, and in nearby Jacmel and Legane, about 1,300 camps erected by hundreds of thousands of Haitians in the hours after their lives were shattered, are becoming permanent slums.*

*Late afternoon torrential rains soak belongings and leave lake-size puddles in which mosquitoes breed, then spread malaria. Deep, raspy coughs can be heard everywhere. Scabies and other infections transform children's soft skin into irritating red bumpy rashes. Bellies are swelling and hair turning orange from malnutrition.*

*In the teeming camp that sprang up on the Pietionville golf course (THIS IS THE CAMP THAT HOPE TO HAITI HELPED SEAN PENN SETUP IN JANUARY) - some estimates set the population at 60,000 -Anne-Suze Denestant, 24, is getting on with life.*

*She pours water over the soapy head of a woman crouched over a plastic basin and runs a hand through the tangled mass. Her other arm is gone at the shoulder.*

*"At least I'm alive," shrugs Denestant with a smile, when asked how she's getting along with the missing limb. "The other people I was trapped with under the rubble are dead."*

*End of story.*

***At least I'm alive..... wow .....***

It breaks my heart.... I have been to Haiti six times since the January quake... I have seen and experienced more death, dying and misery than I could ever share... or want to share for that matter. I am convinced that we will bring about lasting change in Haiti, one person at a time, one church at a time, once school at a time, one community at a time....

The need in Haiti is as great as ever. I outlined in our last email the success we have had addressing many needs from providing over one million meals to distributing over 2500 clean water systems.

This month, I want to share with you two of specific opportunities for your partnership.



1- Bambou Laporte, we have a need to rebuild a church that also serves as a school for 120 children. Currently these children are meeting in a makeshift stick "hut" with only a few tied together bed sheets for a roof. They are in need of chalk boards and other supplies. We can rebuild this school for only \$4000. We will build it as strong as possible to prevent any future weather damage.
