Recently the US has been struck with damaging storms and tornados that have taken the lives of several hundred people. Let me encourage you to give as you can to these relief efforts. Our family has and I encourage you to give also. If you need any direction of how you can get involved directly with the relief in Alabama please contact me. I am aware of several grass root organizations doing great work.

Let me now turn your attention back to 700 miles off the coast of Florida.

As we wrap of the first quarter of 2011, I want to share with you our successes and challenges that we have faced this year. It is hard to believe it has been almost 18 months since the earthquake that devastated Haiti. Since that time we have been able to open several new clean water projects. We currently have ten in operation that provide access to clean water for over one hundred thousand people. We have distributed several hundred home clean water systems to many rural areas. We have increased our school feeding programs as we have been able to fund new schools. We currently are feeding about 3500 children each day in Haiti.



On my most recent visit to Haiti we moved closer to launching our art therapy programs in our schools and orphanages. We interviewed several local Haitians that will go into our schools and conduct art classes. We want to give our children a creative outlet alongside their academics. Haiti was once known as the art capital of the world; and to own a piece of Haitian art was a true joy. Decades of corruption and an uninterested government almost totally ruined the art trade of Haiti. We are hopeful with Haiti's new president that said, in English, during his inauguration address - " To the world let me tell you - Haiti is open for business!"

I am currently planning another trip into Haiti to hold seminars teaching women how to make jewelry out of recycled paper. I am

very excited about this project it will provide jobs, income and new opportunities for the women of Haiti. I believe the key to helping eradicate poverty in the world is to provide opportunities in the form of training and job creation. I have a point person in British Columbia that is very skilled in this area and had a true heart for Haiti. We will hold 3-4 workshops where she will teach people how to create this gorgeous jewelry.



Opportunities abound.... I am expecting a great year of labor in Haiti.

Help spread the word! But one of our new Hope to Haiti Water Bottles. We have partnered with Hope2o to raise money for our efforts. Their mission is to eliminate the use of approximately 180 plastic water bottles per year, per person, therefore reducing the serious environmental and health issues caused by plastic water bottles.

Let me remind you. For several decades now, this is not a new

disaster, tens of thousands of children are dying due to lack of food and clean water. The current estimates are around 50,000 children will die in Haiti every year due to the strained resources. One in every five children born in Haiti will not reach the age of five.

We are feeding children in Haiti for three dollars a month! Your pledge of thirty dollars a month to our organization will save the lives of ten children. I know many people who read our newsletter have the ability to pledge \$50, \$100, \$250 or more each month to our work.

The following is a portion of an article written by Georgianna Nienaber.

*"Ninety-nine years ago on April 15 1912, the RMS Titanic hit an iceberg and sent over 1500 people to their deaths in the icy waters of the North Atlantic. Ironically, the ship Californian was floating not 10 miles away, but ignored the visual SOS from Titanic. It fell to the frustrated crew of the ship Carpathia, 58 miles away, to attempt a rescue that was too little and too late. In January 2010 a 7.0 earthquake in Haiti killed 300,000 immediately, left 1.5 million homeless, and now threatens untold hundreds of thousands with a cholera epidemic that is certain to ramp up once the rainy season begins. "*
